Parables Toward Advent

As we move into the month of November, we continue our 5 week series on the Parables of Jesus. You might remember that we did an 8 week series on Parables back in 2010. After 5 years, it seems worth revisiting these profound stories. The *Holman Illustrated Bible Dictionary* lists 51 parables recorded in Scripture. We don't have time to cover them all, but we will study 5 of them together this fall. Jesus often taught crowds through this storytelling device.



Parables have a way of pulling us into a story and then exposing truth through the story. Yet we must pursue the meaning of the parable if we want to fully grasp its meaning. Michael Green, in *The Message of Matthew*, describes this dynamic,

The parable revealed truth to those who were hungry, and concealed it from those who were too lazy to look for it, or too blinded by hatred and prejudice to discern it.

This series gives us an opportunity to step into first century Palestine. We can imagine Jesus on a hillside or on a boat teaching. He is describing the Kingdom of God. As we engage these stories, we will learn about this Kingdom we continue to pursue.

Following the Parables series, we will move into the Season of Advent. We will follow the lectionary passages into Christmas. As we prepare for Christmas, we are reminded that it is a season of urgency and expectancy. I am looking forward to engaging God's Word with you each week during this season.
